Weather:

- > is the day to day expressions of atmospheric conditions such as temperature, precipitation,
 - humidity, wind speed and direction, cloud cover, and air pressure
- > it affects each of us in many ways (i.e. a snowstorm may cancel school for the day, or a fresh fall of snow creates great conditions for skiing or snowboarding)

Climate:

- > is the long term pattern of atmospheric (weather) conditions
- > weather conditions of a place averaged over a long period of time
- > climates influence where we live, what farmers can grow, which clothes we wear, and how we construct buildings

Answers to Weather and Climate

- 1. a) Today is mostly cloudy to partly sunny skies. Winds are moderate from the east with a high of 4°C and a low of 0°C.
 - b) The climate of Ottawa goes from one extreme to the other, with extremely warm and humid summers and cold, snowy winters. Rain can be expected any time of the year, but late summer, early fall tends to be the wettest seasons. A feature of the climate of Ottawa is the possibility of late autumn heat waves, enjoyed as "Indian summers", which frequently occur.
- 2. a) 3 examples of how weather affects our lives:
 - wind speed & direction on the lake was perfect for sailing nearly every day at camp
 - temperature in your upstairs bedroom was so high in June that you had to sleep in the basement
 - a thunderstorm over the airport delayed your flight to Florida
 - b) 3 examples of how climate affects our lives:
 - sunny climate necessitates the use of sunscreen on a daily basis
 - if you live in a cold climate with a short growing season, you pay more for vegetables because they have to be imported from a warmer climate
 - if you live in a foggy climate, your town needs special street lamps that cut through the fog at night
