Forestry:

What are the three types of harvesting forests and what are the advantages and disadvantages (clear cutting, selective harvest or cutting, shelterwood)

<u>Boreal Forest</u> - biggest forest in Canada - over 50% - made mostly of softwood (Pine, Spruce). Softwood is used for: house building, paper, - Coniferous or evergreens

<u>Hardwood</u> - oak, maple, birch - deciduous (lose their leaves) - firewood, hardwood floors, baseball bats, furniture

<u>Ottawa:</u> we used to float logs down the Ottawa river to the paper mills. Lumberjacks or "Rough Riders" used to float down the river on the logs to clear blockages. It was stopped because of environmental and leisure concerns.

Fossil Fuels:

<u>Coal:</u> Canada still has lots of coal. We mine it and send it to China who uses it for, heat, electricity and to make steel that they ship back to us. Burning coal is CHEAP but very dirty. It is cheaper to do this because labour is so cheap in China.


